

BIOLOGY

Topic- Health and diseases

Microbes can be challenging to learn about. Their names are unpronounceable. Their structures are foreign, but that doesn't mean that they have to be boring!

Students project is focused on microbial diseases which involve researching different types of infectious agents, investigating the diseases they cause, and understanding the mechanisms of infection and treatment. Students can learn about the roles of bacteria, viruses, fungi, and protozoa in causing illness, and explore how these microorganisms interact with the human body.

General instructions-

- * Each student will do the activity individually on file papers.
- *Write your-name, class, section and roll no. on the front page of A-4 sheet.
- *Give a clear and colourful presentation on the given topic.
- *You can make your work more attractive by adding pictures/diagrams.

Each student will write about any one of the disease caused due to-

- 1.Roll no-1-10 Bacteria
- 2. Roll no-11- 20 Virus
- 3. Roll no- 21-30- Fungus
- 4. Roll no-31- last roll no.- Worms/Nematodes

IN YOUR PROJECT MENTION:

- Identify and categorize microbial pathogens: Divide pathogens into bacteria, viruses, fungi and worms/nematodes
- **Investigate the mechanisms of infection:** Understand how pathogens enter the body, replicate, and cause damage.
- **Learn about the immune response:** Explore how the body's defence system fight against microbial infections.

Presentations:

Prepare written presentations on the chosen diseases, including symptoms, causes and treatments.

• The role of hygiene in preventing infections:

Explore how is food, safety practices, and other hygiene measures can reduce the spread of infectious diseases.

In addition to this, you will write about general vaccination and immunisation programme.

Project Title: "Discover India's Tribal Heritage"

Subject Integration: History + Geography

Format: Travel Brochure (Tri-fold paper)

Objective:

Design a travel brochure that encourages tourists to visit a region where a tribal community lives in India. Highlight their history, culture, and geographical environment.

Index

Front Panel (Cover Page):

- Eye-catching title like: "Explore the Land of the Gonds" / "A Journey to the Santhal Heartland"
- Attractive photo or illustration

Inside Panels:

- Introduction to the tribal group
- Historical background: origins, traditions, and key historical facts
- Famous personalities (tribal leaders, freedom fighters, etc.)

Panel 2: Geography and Nature

- Map showing where they live (state/region in India)
- Description of landforms, forests, rivers, and climate
- How geography affects their lifestyle, food, housing, and economy

Panel 3: Culture and Festivals

- Unique clothing, music, dance, and craft
- Major festivals and rituals
- Local tribal cuisine

Message on tribal heritage conservation

Materials You Can Use:

- Chart paper (for tri-fold brochure)
- Printed or hand-drawn maps, photos, and art
- · Coloured pens, stickers, traditional motifs

Creative Element (Optional):

Add a small pocket with a "Tribal Passport" page for stamps or facts.

Objective:
